
Chairman's Report

A Draining Experience - As I sit here on a bright Sunday morning wondering whether to mow the lawn, dig the garden or start on this month's magazine, the phone rings, it is a friend of mine - "did you know the toilets in the car park are filled to overflowing?" - No I didn't, so armed with what suitable tools I could muster, off I went to see what the problem was. When I got there, I just couldn't believe my eyes - yes the toilets were blocked and to compound the problem, people had continued to use them despite the fact that all flushing did was to fill the pan even *further* until it spilled out all over the floor - and people were still trying to use them! Initially I thought that the vandals had paid us a visit again, but closer inspection revealed that this was not a trivial, simple, unblock the pan and all will be OK situation. It transpired that it wasn't just the Gents that was blocked, but also the Ladies and the Disabled toilet.
