

Neighbourhood plans typically take two years to develop and get agreement and we need your involvement every step of the way. As I keep repeating, it is **your** plan: we need your input and commitment. The Steering Group will be keeping you in touch through this newsletter, social media and subsequent consultations. Please keep involved. It only remains for me to wish everyone a very Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year.

Christmas tree recycling

After this year's festivities have ended, Sevenoaks District Council can collect and recycle your real Christmas tree for free throughout January. The Council will collect trees with a trunk of up to 90mm (3.5 inches) in diameter with its Garden Waste Collection Service until the

end of January. Simply leave your tree by the boundary of your property, where you'd usually put your refuse and recycling sacks, by 7am on the day the Council's Garden Waste Collection service visits your road. The good news is that all the trees will be turned into environmentally-friendly compost. For this reason the Council cannot take trees that are decorated or in pots or stands. If your tree is too big for this service, you can take it to one of Kent County Council's Household Waste Recycling sites.
