## Chairman's Report



For those of you who shop at Sainsbury's, you might have noticed that their recycling bins at the bottle bank have changed. This has resulted in SDC no longer having the contract to remove them and as a consequence do not have the resultant income that was generated - which was used to offset your council tax - although at the moment they still operate the Tesco site, this

could also change. It would therefore be much appreciated and beneficial to yourselves if you used the recycling centre in Otford car park, from which SDC do receive an income. If the bins there fill up quicker as a result, we will make arrangements for them to be emptied sooner.

I also understand that as from mid-July SDC will be providing a new version of the white (clear) recycling bags. There will be 30 bags/roll instead of the current 20 and the range of "recyclables" will also increase so please read the accompanying leaflet, or instructions on the bags.



Those of you that use the recreation ground might have noticed that the orbits on the millennium solar system model have now been mowed and will be kept mowed until Winter sets in. We are also trying to keep the labyrinth mowed on Palace Field. If you have not visited either site, now is the opportunity to do so.

When I last spoke with the Kent Highways Manager for the District, we were talking generally about management and resources - his view was that in today's world it's not so much about project, staff or fiscal management, but more about managing people's expectations - especially the general public. All around us change is occurring. We see it on our national news and in our local papers. It is an inevitable sign of moving forward into any new period. We may be a small village tucked away in a beautiful valley but we are not immune to changes which occur. How those changes may affect us is important though.



You have a parish council in Otford, made up of 11 residents, whose purpose is to represent our wider community and do everything possible to ensure that our lives are not adversely affected whether it is from natural causes, like flood, storm or drought, or from man-made causes like traffic congestion or dog fouling. Mundane matters, like a blocked public toilet can be as important

as fighting a major development being proposed on our doorstep. The role of parish councillors is varied and requires a lot of multi-tasking.

If you don't wish to become a councillor but have skills and interests that you think might be useful for any projects that the Parish Council may have going forward perhaps you would consider joining a volunteer database for the Parish Council. If you would be prepared to possibly give an hour or so on an ad hoc basis we would love to hear from you.



Planning to protect our village against threats from outside our boundaries is however an ever present role for a parish council. In Otford we are, by our very location, so close to London and the Sevenoaks conurbation that we are in a very vulnerable position. We cannot afford to be complacent and simply respond to problems as they occur. By that time it can often be too late to take effective

action. We need to be proactive not reactive, to look ahead and plan for the future. We did this with the Parish Plan five years ago and the achievement of so many of the plans objectives has visibly created an improvement in people's lives. Now another period lies ahead of us and we must look to see in what areas we will be most vulnerable to the effects that these may bring.



The threat of increasing traffic levels will definitely become one of our major future battlegrounds. The Fort Halstead development, the completion of Rye Meadows (only half its housing quota has been completed) and the plans for a major international theme park to the east of Dartford, will all have a direct

impact upon us. So what action should we take? What action can we take? What action will we be allowed to take? What would you like to see done? How do you see the future of Otford? All these questions need answering, so if you can help, please pass your ideas to the office for us to take forward.



Please note that due to an ongoing problem with vandalism in the **Children's Play Area** on the High Street Recreation Ground it will now be locked overnight at approximately **7pm** and be re-opened before **8am**.


## Otford Primary School Fete
